



## Use of mobile devices while driving: key changes to the law

In March a new law came into effect regarding the use of mobile phones when behind the wheel. This infographic illustrates the key aspects of the law change.

It's now "illegal to hold and use a phone, sat nav, tablet, or any device that can send or receive data, while driving or riding a motorcycle." <sup>1</sup>





## **Exceptions to this are if you:**



need to call 999 or 112 in an emergency



are safely parked




are making a contactless payment in a vehicle that is not moving, for example at a drive-through



are using the device to park your vehicle remotely

## You can use the device hands-free as long as you don't hold them at any point. The following are considered 'hands-free':



## Penalties can include:



Up to 6 penalty points



Maximum fine of £2,500



Loss of licence



Driving ban
